1 mile (mi)	1.609 kilometres
1 yard (yd)	91.44 centimetres
1 foot (ft)	30.48 centimetres
1 inch (in.)	2.54 centimetres
1 stone	3.175 kilogrammes
1 pound (lb)	453.59 grammes
1 ounce (oz)	28.35 grammes
1 grain	64.8 milligrammes

Note: The American measures may be different.
